Dear Parents and Carers

Dino and I are excited to welcome you back to school. We hope that you enjoyed a peaceful and restful holiday break with your children and that you have had a good start to the new year. The high school continues to grow and we will have just over 40 more students in the MSS as we start the school year. We especially want to welcome our new families to Calvary, particularly our Year 7 families starting high school for the first time, and pray that your time with us is a blessed one. We have lots of exciting activities, cocurricular events, house competitions, a musical and more planned for our 2026 year and we hope that you encourage your child to take part in experiences that take place beyond the classroom.

We believe that for our students to successfully thrive at school we need to have an effective partnership between the school and parents, and so we will always welcome the opportunity to talk with you should you ever want to reach out to us about any issues or concerns you may have regarding your child's educative experience. Although rewarding, parenting is a tough job, and the College will seek to support our parents across the year with resources and articles from our Wellbeing Team and once again we are bringing parenting expert and author Dr. Judith Locke to our College on the 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> of February to run parenting sessions.

This year our teachers are looking to consolidate on the positive culture we have in the MSS and to continue to raise expectations in the classroom. In line with our College expectations 'be kind, be fair, be your best self' (inspired by Micah 6:8) we will be endeavouring to be our best selves by collectively working toward positive and productive work habits that will lay good foundations for life beyond school.

In a world saturated by AI shortcuts and IT designed to distract, we will be refining our use of technology to consistently use it purposefully and productively. We have new IT programs that our students should find make learning more effective and engaging, but we are balancing our technology use out with distraction free approaches to learning and would remind everyone to please ensure that students have a physical paper notebook for every subject. In 2025 we also noticed a creeping trend of smart watches making their way onto school grounds and would remind students that there is statewide ban on both smartphones and smart watches. Students who bring smart watches to school will be required to leave them in their lockers alongside their mobile phones.

The remainder of this communication contains important information about the start of the school year, which we ask all families to please read. We look forward to partnering with you in your child's education and eagerly anticipate a year filled with God's providence and blessing.

**WHAT TO DO/BRING FOR THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL***What to wear:*

- On the first day (27 Jan) please wear your House shirt and sport shorts with the correct sport shoes (and socks).

*What to bring:*

- Please bring your stationery and books to put in your locker.
- Students with laptops should bring these.
- Ensure you have a Calvary hat, a water bottle and food (the Mango Café is open and available that day).

*Where do I go at the start of the day?*

Supervised areas in the morning include the Western Carpark hanger, the Pavilion and Café areas until 8:35am. There will be lots of teachers out and about on the first morning and at 8:35am they will direct students to their respective student areas for the start of the day. We will sort out lockers, etc., after the start of the day.

## KEY 2026 INFORMATION

## BOOKLISTS

Our booklists are structured around allowing you to make choices that suit your budget and child's personal taste. **I would like to stress the need for all students to have a physical notebook for every subject.** Each week, some lessons in classes will require students to use a notebook and not a laptop. Please ensure your child has the stationery they need to start the year. Booklists are available online on the Parent Information page and can be ordered directly through Officeworks for your convenience. You do not need to buy from Officeworks if you find like stationery elsewhere.

## SHOE REMINDER

### Sport Shoe



Predominantly white or black leather or mesh laced sports shoe.

### Formal Shoe (Unisex)



Must be a black leather laced formal school shoe.

**Please note that students cannot wear sport shoes as formal shoes.**

## HAIR

*If your child's hair style is in breach of our uniform policy, they will be excluded from returning to school until their hair is compliant with our uniform policy:*

Hair must be neat, tied up (if long), and presentable.

- It must be a natural looking colour
- All forms of mullets, rat tails, undercuts and extreme hair styles are not permitted.

**Hair length:**

- Hair at the sides and back of the head must be similar length and suitably blended.
- Hair at the top of the head must be tied up if it is long and falls over the sides and back.
- Hair must be off the ears, off the eyebrows (1cm above), and off the collar.
- You may shave your head, but you are not permitted to carve patterns, symbols, lines, etc. into your hair.

**HATS**

Students must have both a formal hat and a sport hat. You are expected to wear the right hat with the right uniform every day. Hats may be left in lockers to assist students in meeting this expectation.

**JEWELLERY/MAKE UP****Jewellery**

- Necklaces and rings are not permitted.
- Earrings must be one single plain stud or sleeper (6mm or less) in the lower lobe of the ear.

**Smart watches are not permitted (students may wear a standard watch).**

Make up (mascara/visible foundation/eye shadow, etc) is not permitted. Fake eye lashes are not permitted.
